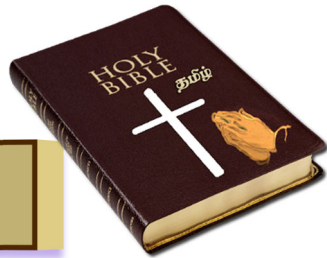
Courage / Encourage

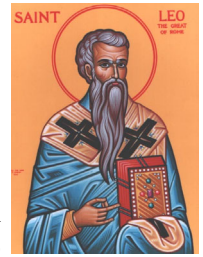

SAINTS
OF THE DAY

Nov 10 **Leo the Great** Died in 461; eminent pastor and preacher; pope; doctor of the Church; defender of the Roman primacy; combated Pelagianism and Manichaeism; many of his prayers are found in the *Roman Missal*; saved Rome from marauding Huns and Vandals.



Nov 11 **Martin of Tours** Died in 397; from Hungary; soldier turned Christian at 18; disciple of St. Hilary; at Ligugé, founded 1st monastery in the West; bishop; first non-martyr with annual feast in the Western Church; patron of soldiers, wine producers and of France.



Nov 12 **Josaphat** Died in 1623; born in Poland, raised Ukrainian Orthodox; bishop; his fidelity to the Roman See and his desire for union between the Ukrainian Church and Rome led to his murder; first formally canonized saint of the Eastern Rite.



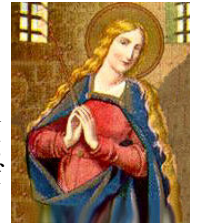
Nov 13 **Frances Xavier Cabrini** Died in 1917 in Chicago; from Lombardy; youngest of 13 children; founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart; established 67 institutions in the US (schools, hospitals and orphanages) in 28 years; first US citizen canonized; patroness of immigrants and migrants.



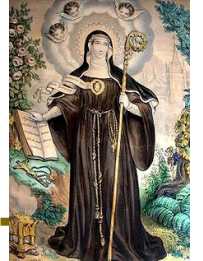
Nov 15 **Albert the Great** Died in 1280; master of philosophy, theology and the natural sciences, especially Aristotle; teacher of St. Thomas; Provincial of the German Dominicans; bishop of Regensburg; prolific writer; wrote on the cult of the Sacred Heart; patron of scientists.



Nov 16 **Margaret of Scotland** Died in 1093; from Hungary; wife of King Malcolm III of Scotland and mother of 8 children; helped root out paganism; her love for the poor became legendary; patroness of Scotland.



Nov 16 **Gertrude** Died in 1301; called "the Great"; Benedictine mystic; wrote on the meaning of suffering, the Sacred Heart, the Trinity and God's love.
