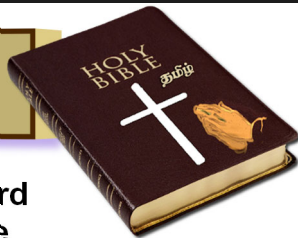
Courage / Encourage

SAINTS OF THE DAY

Nov 17 Elizabeth of Hungary Died in 1231 at age 24; wife of Louis IV and mother of 3; as a widow, she became a Franciscan tertiary, dedicate to the needs of the poor and the sick; patroness of Catholic charities.



Nov 18 Dedication of the Basilicas of Saints Peter and Paul Around 330, Constantine built a basilica over the tomb of St. Peter. Reconstruction began in the 14th century and the present basilica of St. Peter was consecrated in 1626. The construction of St. Paul's began in 386, was destroyed by a fire in 1823 and the new basilica was consecrated in 1854.



Nov 18 Rose Philippine Duchesne Died in 1852 at age 83 in Missouri; from France; founded the first American house of the Religious of the Sacred Heart; opened the first American free school west of the Mississippi; known for her courage and desire to serve native Americans; called "the woman who prays always."

Thanks to the generosity of those who already donated and those who wish to donate, which helped to make this project possible. God bless you.



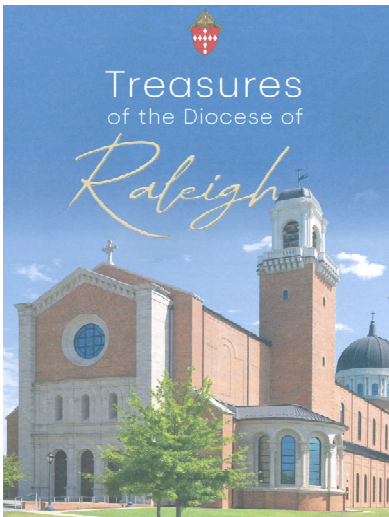
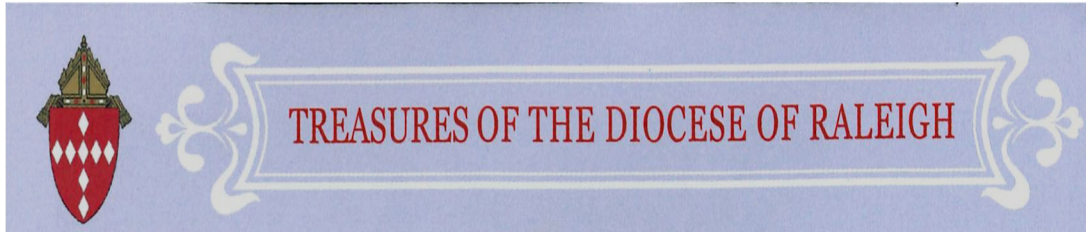
Remodulación de la iglesia

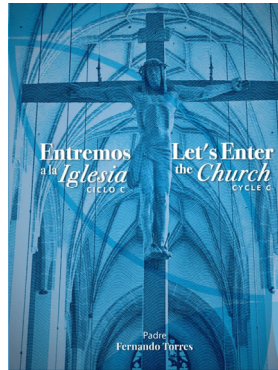

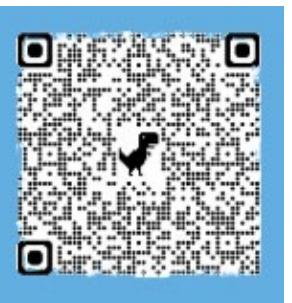

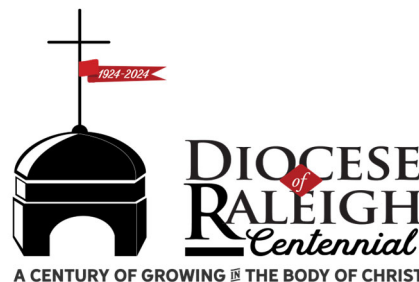
