Welcome to our parish. We invite you to register, as soon as possible. Registration forms are available in the office during office hours, in the Tower Room or on our parish website. Though a rather simple act, registration allows the parish to know how many families live in the parish. It also provides an official record of your membership and is essential for sacramental preparations and sponsorship certification.

Sacrament of Baptism

Parents must be registered members of the Parish and in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church. Participation in the Pre-Baptismal Program is required. Parents must register by calling the parish office.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Arrangements must be made with the Pastor at least six months in advance. Participation in Marriage Preparation Workshop is required.

Sacrament of Anointing

The sacrament is celebrated upon request prior to surgery or at the time of illness. Please notify the Parish office of the illness or hospitalization of a parishioner.

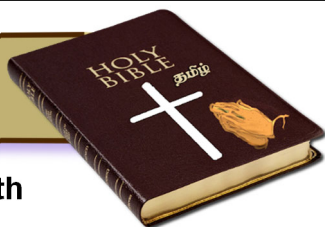


Columbarium

SAINTS OF THE DAY



Oct 6 Bruno Died in 1101; celebrated teacher and close advisor to his former pupil, Pope Urban II; founded the mother house of the Carthusians; sought “to seek God assiduously, to find God promptly, and to possess God fully”; motto: “While the world changes, the cross stands firm.”



Oct 6 Marie Rose Durocher Died in 1849 at the age of 38; born in Quebec; began the first Canadian parish sodality for young women; founded the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary for Christian education.

Oct 7 Our Lady of the Rosary Established in 1571 in thanksgiving for the victory at Lepanto.



Oct 9 Denis and companions Died in 258, also called Dionysius; first bishop of Paris; martyred with the presbyter, Eleutherius and deacon, Rusticus on Montmartre; patron of Paris and France.



Oct 9 John Leonardi Died in 1609 in Rome; founded the Congregation of Clerics Regular of the Mother of God; in 1579 formed the *Confraternity of Christian Doctrine* (CCD), and published a compendium of Christian doctrine in use until the 19th century; cofounded the Collegio Urbano in Rome, which still trains priests for the foreign missions.



Oct 11 John XXIII Died in 1963 of stomach cancer; pope; born in Italy in 1881; ordained a priest in 1904; served in WWI as stretcher-bearer; became National Director for the Propagation of the Faith; became a papal diplomat serving Bulgaria, Turkey and France; helped save an estimated 24,000 Jewish people in WWII; named cardinal in 1953; elected pope in 1958 at age 78; he convoked the 2nd Vatican Council; his feast day recalls the day of the first session of the 2nd Vatican Council in 1962.
