It also provides an official record of your membership and is essential for sacramental preparations and sponsorship certification.

Sacrament of Baptism
Parents must be registered members of the Parish and in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church. Participation in the Pre-Baptismal Program is required. Parents must register by calling the parish office.

Sacrament of Matrimony
Arrangements must be made with the Pastor at least six months in advance. Participation in Marriage Preparation Workshop is required.

Sacrament of Anointing
The sacrament is celebrated upon request prior to surgery or at the time of illness. Please notify the Parish office of the illness or hospitalization of a parishioner.

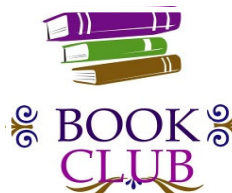
Children's Hunger Elimination of Wilson (CHEW)

Baptism Preparation Class

SAINTS OF THE DAY

**Sept 8 Nativity of the Blessed
Virgin Mary**

This 5th century feast marks the anniversary of the dedication of a basilica in Jerusalem built, according to tradition, on the location of the home of St. Anne, the mother of Mary.



Sept 9 Peter Claver

Died in 1654; Jesuit who served in the Colombian mission in Cartagena; devoted to caring for African slaves for 38 years; called himself “the slave of the slaves”; patron of Colombia and of all missions to black people.



Sept 12 Most Holy Name of Mary God the Father is glorified by the exalted role in salvation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Thus, her name is a name of honor, a holy name, a maternal name, and a name responsive to the needs of the Church.

Sept 13 John Chrysostom Died in 407; bishop of Constantinople; outstanding preacher; defended the poor; sought reform of the clergy; twice exiled due to royal opposition; one of the four great doctors of the Eastern Church; patron of preachers and of Istanbul.



Sept 14 Exaltation of the Holy Cross This feast celebrates a double anniversary. One of the building in 335 of the Anastasis (a round church, built above the empty grave of Jesus), the Martyrium (a basilica) and Calvarium (a shrine in the square between the two marking the place of the crucifixion). The other is the discovery of the Lord’s cross by the empress, St. Helene in 320.

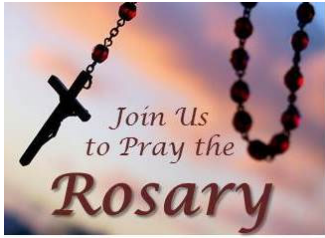

The Rosary is at heart a biblical prayer, developed as we know it from the Middle Ages. It developed out of

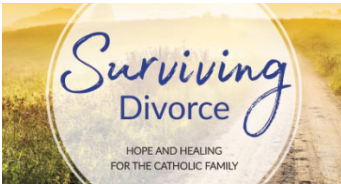
an ancient practice in which people who could not read Scripture recited 150 Our Father's in honor of the 150 psalms. Strings of beads were used to keep track.

Project Rachel Support Group

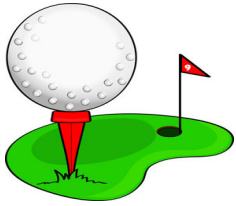
