Welcome to our parish. We invite you to register, as soon as possible. Registration forms are available in the office during office hours, in the Tower Room or on our parish website. Though a rather simple act, registration allows the parish to know how many families live in the parish. It also provides an official record of your membership and is essential for sacramental preparations and sponsorship certification.

Sacrament of Baptism

Parents must be registered members of the Parish and in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church. Participation in the Pre-Baptismal Program is required. Parents must register by calling the parish office.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Arrangements must be made with the Pastor at least six months in advance. Participation in Marriage Preparation Workshop is required.

Sacrament of Anointing

The sacrament is celebrated upon request prior to surgery or at the time of illness. Please notify the Parish office of the illness or hospitalization of a parishioner.







BAPTISM PREPARATION
Our baptism preparation class, for baptisms that will be celebrated in English, is usually held the second Sunday of each month from 12:30pm-1:30pm.

Our next class is February 9. Pre-registration at least a week in advance is required. Please call the

Church office to register. This class is required for all parents who will have their child baptized at St. Therese. We will not schedule a baptism until the parents have attended the class. Any parishioner that will be a godparent at St. Therese or in another parish may also attend.

Baptisms in English will take place **after the 11am Mass one Sunday a month.** The February date for baptisms will be published soon.

January 26

Timothy and Titus


Died in 1st century; Timothy was from Lystra in Asia Minor; Titus was from Greek origin; companions of St. Paul and overseers of the churches of Ephesus and Crete; recipients of the so-called pastoral epistles.



January 27

Angela Merici


Died in 1540; orphaned at 10; foundress of the Ursulines, the first teaching order especially for poor young girls; sought re-evangelization of families through the education of future wives and mothers.



January 28

Thomas Aquinas

Died in 1274; the “Angelic Doctor” who wrote *Summa Theologiae* and authored *Adoro te devote*, *O salutaris*, *Tantum ergo* and *Pange lingua*; patron of Catholic schools, colleges and universities; of philosophers, theologians and booksellers.



January 31

John Bosco

Died in 1888; founded the Salesians; dedicated to educating youth; a pioneer in vocational training; first saint in history to submit to a press interview; first canonized saint in whose honor a national holiday was declared in Italy; patron of editors.




Rosary Beads Donations Needed




