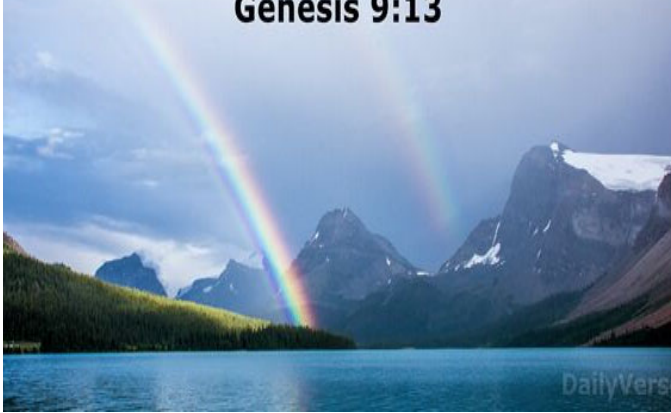

Though a rather simple act, registration allows the parish to know how many families live in the parish. It also provides an official record of your membership and is essential for sacramental preparations and sponsorship certification.

Sacrament of Baptism

Parents must be registered members of the Parish and in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church. Participation in the Pre-Baptismal Program is required. Parents must register by calling the parish office.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Arrangements must be made with the Pastor at least six months in advance. Participation in Marriage Preparation Workshop is required.

Sacrament of Anointing

The sacrament is celebrated upon request prior to surgery or at the time of illness. Please notify the Parish office of the illness or hospitalization of a parishioner.

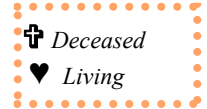

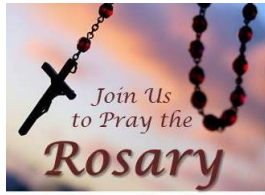


Cornerstone Charismatic Prayer Group



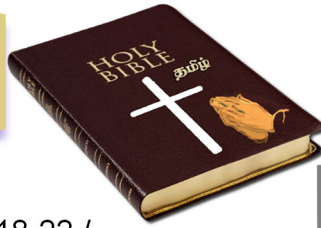

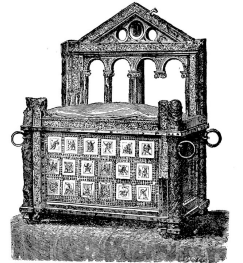

SAINTS OF THE DAY

February 21 **Peter Damian** Died in 1072; indefatigable defender of the Gregorian reform; monk, later Cardinal bishop; promoter of religious life.



February 22 **Chair of St. Peter the Apostle** This feast, attested as early as the mid-fourth century, has its roots in the commemoration of dead relatives and friends. At this commemoration, a chair was left empty for particular deceased persons. Since the actual date of Peter's death is unknown, it is celebrated on the day he took pastoral responsibility of the Church of Rome.



February 23 **Polycarp** Died in 155 at age of 86; disciple of St. John; bishop of Smyrna; his *Letter to the Philippians* witnesses to various New Testament writings; burned at the stake; one of the first martyrs to be venerated.

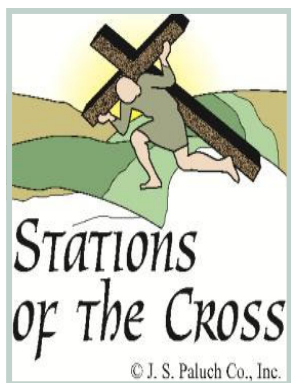

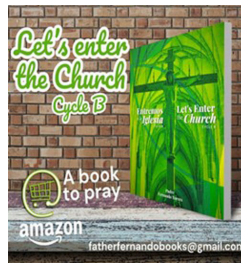

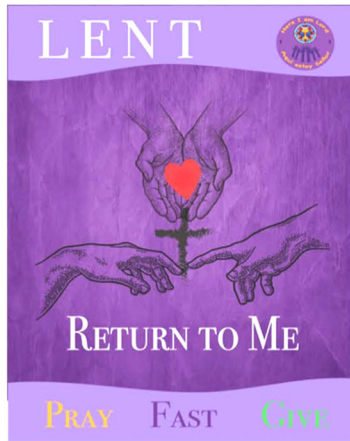

- † Purify ourselves by replacing the desires of the body and mind with our true heart's desire to love God and love one another
- † Put down your cell phone and pick up your child
- † Give up the addiction to social media, television, and other material possessions

Norms

- The "Gloria" is omitted.
- The "Alleluia" is omitted.
- No ornaments or flowers in the Church at any time.
- The color purple is used.
- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of **fasting and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence.**
 - Fasting is observed for all between the ages of 18-59. **One full meal and two small meals that do not equal another full meal are allowed.**
 - Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. **On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed.**
