Sacrament of Baptism

Parents must be registered members of the Parish and in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church. Participation in the Pre-Baptismal Program is required. Parents must register by calling the parish office.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Arrangements must be made with the Pastor at least six months in advance. Participation in Marriage Preparation Workshop is required.

Sacrament of Anointing

The sacrament is celebrated upon request prior to surgery or at the time of illness. Please notify the Parish office of the illness or hospitalization of a parishioner.

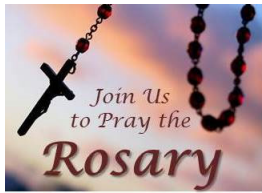


Cornerstone Charismatic Prayer Group

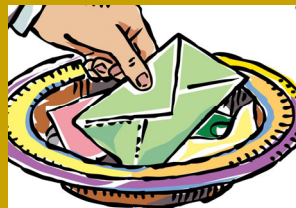

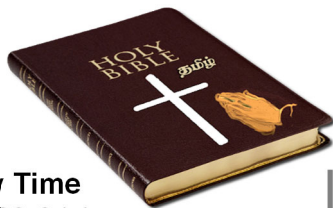

SAINTS OF THE DAY

January 21 Agnes Died in the 4th century at the age of 12; patroness of Christian virtue confronted by political and social violence; represented with a martyr's palm and a lamb (her name in Latin means "lamb").



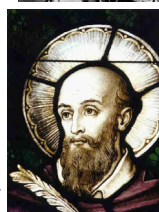
January 23 Vincent Died in the 4th century in the persecution of Diocletian at Valencia; deacon of the church of Saragossa; protomartyr of Spain; patron of wine-producers.



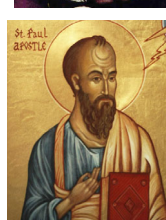
January 23 Marianne Cope Died in 1918; a religious of the Sisters of St. Francis of Syracuse, NY; known for her charitable works and virtuous deeds; for 35 years she cared for the lepers on the island of Molokai.



January 24 Francis de Sales Died in 1622; bishop of Geneva; sought to bring many back to the Church through his personal life and writings; co-founder of the Visitation Order; patron of writers, journalists and the deaf.



January 25 Conversion of Saint Paul Paul is converted and becomes the apostle sent to proclaim to all the nations the saving gospel.



January 26 Timothy and Titus Died in 1st century; Timothy was from Lystra in Asia Minor; Titus was from Greek origin; companions of St. Paul and overseers of the churches of Ephesus and Crete; recipients of the so-called pastoral epistles.



January 27 Angela Merici Died in 1540; orphaned at 10; foundress of the Ursulines, the first teaching order especially for poor young girls; sought re-evangelization of families through the education of future wives and mothers.

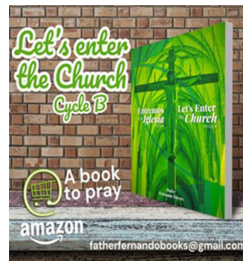

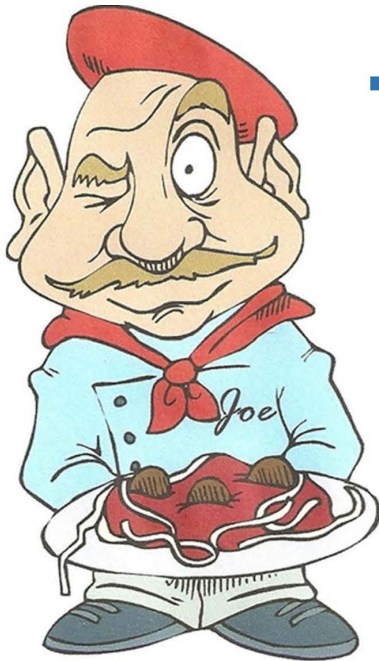
